From NAMT's Executive Director, Kathy Evans

The 15th Annual Festival of New Musicals was my first as Executive Director. We were in two small theatres on 42nd street, since torn down, which seated 450 industry members. For the 16th Festival, we were the first event ever produced at this theatre complex, and today, for the fourth year in a row, we are gathered at New World Stages with nearly 1000 industry professionals and artists, seeing great work by established and emerging writers.

In those five years, we have presented staged readings of 40 musicals and almost every one has had a developmental or full production as a direct result of the Festival. One highlight is *The Drowsy Chaperone* – winner of five Tony awards and now on national tour. Soon to open on Broadway in 2009 are *Vanities, A New Musical* and *The Story of My Life. I Love You Because* and *Striking 12* were Off-Broadway hits, and there were countless regional successes, including *Ace, Emma, Harold and Maude, The Flight of the Lawnchair Man, Meet John Doe,* and *Princesses.* Just the musicals listed here have entertained hundreds of thousands of theatergoers. The full impact of the past 20 years is countless!

Our NAMT members – some of the leading professional producers of musical theatre in the world – have played a crucial role in the development of almost every Festival show. We hope that the other producers and artistic directors here today will consider joining the National Alliance of Musical Theatre. We are a thriving and vital network, passionate about the future of this beautiful art form.



Act One of Barnstormer was presented at the York Theater Company in March 2003. The Lark Play Development Center received a 2004 NAMT Producer/Writer Initiative Award and a 2005 Jonathan Larson Performing Arts Foundation Award to support Barnstormer's development, culminating in a reading, April 2005, and a BareBones presentation in November 2005. The Village Theatre funded a developmental workshop in April, 2007. All presentations were directed by Jerry Dixon. Cheryl Davis received the Kleban Award for her libretto and Douglas Cohen received the Anna Sosenko Assist Trust, which partially funded a reading in Hartford Stage Company's Brand: NEW Festival, November 2007. Barnstormer is scheduled to be presented as part of in Alabama Shakespeare Festival's acclaimed Southern Writers' Project in May 2009.

CHERYL L. DAVIS (Book & Lyrics) Cheryl's work has been read and performed nationally, including at the Cleveland Play House, the Actors Theatre of Louisville, and the Kennedy Center. She is a co-recipient of the 2005 Kleban Award for her work as a librettist. Her play about the desegregation of the nation's school system, *The Color of Justice*, received critical acclaim, including excellent reviews in the New York Times and Daily News, and is toured regularly by Theatreworks/USA. She has a degree in English and a Certificate in Theatre and Dance from Princeton University, and was a Dramatists Guild Fellow in 2002. She is a member of the Dramatists Guild. She is a partner in the law firm of Menaker & Herrmann, LLP.

DOUGLAS J. COHEN (Music) Doug is a composer/lyricist of the Broadway bound *The Big Time*, which debuted at NYMF with a book by Douglas Carter Beane and directed by Christopher Ashley, and will have a major workshop this fall. He won two Richard Rodgers Awards and the Gilman & Gonzalez-Falla Theater Foundation Award for writing the book, music, and lyrics to *No Way to Treat a Lady* (optioned for a New York revival and produced twice off-Broadway—Outer Critics Circle nomination Best Revival, York Theatre Co.) and *The Gig* (Goodspeed, Manhattan Theatre Club Stage II, Sacramento Music Circus, NAMT Fest 1994, and now on Jay Records). Nominated for a 2005 Drama Desk Award for Oustanding Lyrics for *Children's Letters to God* (Lamb's Theatre), Doug is composer of *Glimmerglass* (Goodspeed, Spirit of Broadway, NAMT Fest 2000), composer-lyricist and co-librettist of *The Opposite of Sex* (Williamstown Theatre Festival, Magic Theatre), and contributed original songs to the off-Broadway show, *Boozy*, written and produced by the Obie Award-winning Les Freres Corbusier.

Pamela's First Musical is the story of a young suburban girl who feels out of place. Pamela's active fantasy life and infatuation with Broadway Cast CDs keeps her from being too sad or lonely. On the occasion of her 11th birthday she learns that her father is about to re-marry. Just when Pamela thinks her entire world is going to crash, her eccentric Aunt Louise arrives. Aunt Louise is a New York fashion designer who sweeps Pamela off to New York City and her first Broadway musical. There, she meets producers, writers, actors, directors and choreographers and discovers the world of Broadway Theater and its off-stage and on-stage magic. As Aunt Louise says "A Broadway Musical can cure anything."

WENDY WASSERSTEIN Her play The Heidi Chronicles won the 1989 Pulitzer Prize, Tony Award, and Susan Smith Blackburn Prize; the New York Drama Critics Circle, Drama Desk, and Outer Critics Circle Awards; and earned her a grant from the Kennedy Center Fund for New American Plays. For The Sisters Rosensweig, she received the 1993 Outer Critics Circle Award, a Tony Award nomination, and the William Inge Award for Distinguished Achievement in American Theatre. Her other plays include Third; Old Money; An American Daughter; Uncommon Women and Others; Isn't It Romantic; a musical, Miami (with Jack Feldman and Bruce Sussman); Waiting for Philip Glass, included in Love's Fire; and Welcome to My Rash. Her books include the novel Elements of Style, the essay collections Shiksa Goddess (Or How I Spent My Forties) and Bachelor Girls, and Sloth. She started The Open Doors Program, which brings New York City Public High School students to plays accompanied by professional theatre artists. The program is run by the Theatre Development Fund in New York.



CY COLEMAN (June 14, 1929 - November 18, 2004) Coleman's Broadway shows include Wildcat, Sweet Charity, Seesaw, On The Twentieth Century, Barnum, Welcome to the Club, City of Angels, The Will Rogers Follies and The Life. In addition, he composed scores for memorable television specials for Shirley MacLaine, Bob Hope, and Peggy Lee.
