



Originally a play by Patricia Cotter, in 2001 The Break Up Notebook premiered at the LA Gay and Lesbian Center earning a GLAAD nomination. In 2005, the musical had its World Premiere at the Hudson Theatre in Hollywood, produced by Rose Marcario, where it received an Ovation Award for Best World Premiere Musical, an L.A. Drama Critics Circle Award for Best Musical Score, and six Garland Awards, including Best Adaptation. The show has since been work-shopped at NAMT Member Baldwin-Wallace College Conservatory of Music and produced at San Diego's Diversionary Theatre.

PATRICIA COTTER (Book) adapted her play *The Break Up Notebook*, (GLAAD Award nominee) into: *The Breakup Notebook*: *The Lesbian Musical* (composer Lori Scarlett) and for which she received the Ovation Award for World Premier Musical, and a Garland Award for Best Adaptation. Other produced plays include: *Flawed*; *Best/Worst*; *The Girls*; *Three*; and *Fat*, a musical comedy about eating disorders. She has co-written a screenplay with Dustin Hoffman for Punch Productions, written for Disney Theatrical, and Twentieth Century Fox Television. In 2004 she received a Daytime Emmy Award for her comedy writing on Comedy Central's "Win Ben Stein's Money".

The first was performed at the ninety-nine seat Coronet Theater in July 2002. The second reading was held at the El Portal Theater in Los Angeles in September 2003.
