WHAT DOES NAMT DO?

CONFERENCES:

FESTIVAL OF NEW MUSICALS:

NAMT hosts two conferences annually in March and October. The Spring Conference focuses on administrative topics such as Marketing and Development while the Fall Conference has a focus on New Works. These two-day conferences bring together staff from our 200+ member theatres to share ideas, establish best practices and network with colleagues from around the country.

NAMT produces a Festival of New Musicals every October. 8 shows are showcased in 45 minute presentations over a two day festival. Since the festival began in 1989, 284 shows and 559 writers have had their work seen by leaders in the industry. 85% of shows in the Festival have gone on to further development, workshops or productions.

WHAT DOES NAMT DO?

GRANT MAKING PROGRAMS:

MEMBER **RESOURCES:**

NAMT operates two grant-making programs, The Frank Young Fund for New Musicals (FYFNM) and the Impact & Exploration Fund (I&EF). Through a competitive submission process, the FYFNM provides grants to support new musicals at all stages of development, at theatres of all sizes, with the goal of bringing quality and diverse new musicals to audiences across the country. Under this umbrella, we offer Project Development, Production, and Writers Residency Grants to support writers producing at member theatres. The Impact & Exploration Fund, which launched in 2017, is designed to help NAMT members pilot new capacity-building programs to advance their missions. Areas of exploration may include technology, accessibility, audience development, education and artistic innovation and advancement.

NAMT compiles resources that include recordings of webinars, I&EF grant reports, the New Musicals Map, EDI & Anti-Racism resources and more on our website within the Knowledge Exchange section. We also hold monthly town hall meetings, giving members an open forum to discuss arts management issues facing their theatres as well as the industry as a whole.
